InSOPHE stands for the *Indiana Society for Public Health Education*. InSOPHE is a state-wide chapter of the national SOPHE, and serves as a non-profit, professional association for health education professionals and students.

What does InSOPHE do?

- Raises awareness of the connection between behavioral sciences, health education, health promotion, and the surrounding environment.

- Provides networking opportunities with others in the public health field.
- Provides members opportunities for free or reduced CHES/MCHES credits.
- Brings together health experts and speakers to host annual Fall conference.
- Awards one student scholarship toward the CHES exam.
